

Campground and picnic area

Camping

The shelters have filtered drinking water and toilets.

No camping in front of the large picnic shelter, as shown on the map.

Please pay your camp fees at one of the machines in the information centre.

Sites cannot be booked. You can stay a maximum of 7 days consecutively, and up to 40 days in a calendar year.

BBQs

The electric BBQs in the four picnic shelters are free for you to use. Just push the button to start one. Remember to leave them clean for the next users.

Portable stoves and BBQs can be used in the camping areas and in the picnic areas around Pākura Forks.

Campfires

Enjoy a campfire on the stony riverbed. See the locations on the map. Remember to bring your own firewood. Never leave your fire unattended and ensure it is fully out when finished.

Caring for your park

-  Dogs are welcome. Don't let them wander. Keep them under control and remove droppings.
-  Please use the recycling and rubbish bins provided.
-  Light no fires except on the stony riverbed. Portable stoves and BBQs can be used.
-  No mountain bikes on the walking tracks.
-  No horses on the walking tracks. Permit required for horse riding.
-  Do not remove, disturb or damage native plants or animals.
