Kia ora Craig,

Thank you for getting in contact regarding concerns which residents in Bell Road, Lower Hutt brought forward at the Seaview WWTP CLG meeting on 28/03/2023. Of concern to a resident was "the safety of the deodoriser deployed to mask potential odours citing some of the ingredients were harmful to human health e.g., ammonia salts" and you asked us to provide information on the health effects.

The National Public Health Service requested information on the deodorising product that is used at the Seaview Waste Water Treatment Plant. You provided the safety data sheet and the dilution rate for Hi Chem Disinfectant Reodorant of 500:1 ratio. We have looked into this product using the Safety Data Sheet and the national TOXINZ database.

Hi Chem Disinfectant Reodorant has a Hazard Classification for skin and eye irritation by direct contact (6.4A and 6.3A) but not inhalation. It has an EPA Group Standard: HSR002530 - Cleaning Products (Subsidiary Hazard) Group Standard, with generic procedures for using this chemical. Hi Chem Disinfectant Reodorant is then diluted 500:1 by Veolia and dispersed using a cannon. The ingredient of concern are Quaternary ammonium compounds, alkylbenzyldimethyl, chlorides, which make up <10% of the Hi Chem Disinfectant Reodorant. Dilution at a 500:1 ratio results in a solution of <0.02% strength.

Exposure Route

Ingestion: Health concerns are most likely following exposure by ingestion (swallowing) solutions containing >7.5% quaternary ammonium compounds. This type of exposure would require handling undiluted product with accidental ingestion and is not relevant for potential public exposures.

Skin Contact: Repeated or prolonged skin contact, including via inappropriate application of therapeutic shampoos and via airborne vapour or mist, may result in local effects ranging from irritation or uncommonly allergic contact dermatitis at concentrations > 0.1%, to mild irritation at < 5%, moderate irritation at 5 to 10%, and severe irritation or skin burns at concentrations > 10%. Given the dilute nature of the product utilised in the cannon (<0.02% strength) and the further dilution as the droplets travel in the air, this is not expected to be a health concern for the general public.

Eye Contact: Eye contact with < 0.1% solutions are not usually associated with symptoms. Repeated exposure may cause transient irritation. Mild irritation can occur with strengths of 0.1%. The concentration of product utilised in the cannon would not be expected to be at a level that is associated with eye irritation.

Inhalation: Breathing in concentrated quaternary ammonium compounds, especially with repeated exposure has been associated with reports of lung irritation, and a higher risk of developing asthma in workers using p ducts with quaternary ammonium compounds. It is not expected that the dilute product utilised in the cannon would present a risk to the general public.

Summary

Potential health concerns associated with exposure to quaternary ammonium compounds are mot likely associated with direct contact with undiluted product i.e. the staff preparing the solution. Staff exposur risk managed by following the correct health and safety procedures. Quaternary ammonium compounds reoften part of household cleaning and disinfection products and so exposure to the public is relatively common. Given the level of dilution of the product used in the cannon, and the distance between the placement of the annon and potential locations for public exposure (typically this type of cannon dispersal method has an estimated drollet ange of 50-100 metres) that effectively dilutes the strength further, we would not expect this to epresent a health risk for the general public.

Planning assessment – Seaview odour cannon

Section 15 of the RMA controls discharges of contaminant to the environment, with part 2 stating that unless the contaminant is specifically permitted by a rule in a plan resource consent it is prohibited.

The definition of contaminant is a substance (inc uding gases, odorous compounds, liquids, solids, and microorganisms) that when discharged is likely to change the physical, chemical, or biological condition of the environment into which it is discharged.

The proposal to control odours from the S aview WWTP by discharge of a product via a mobile odour cannon would then need to meet the test bo h definition of a contaminant and the discharge rules in the regional plan to be compliant.

The appeals version 2022 f Greater Wellington's Natural Resources Plan contains the relevant regional rules for the manage environmental discharges with chapter 5.1 managing discharges to air.

The discharge to air of he de dorising product meets the definition of a contaminant however there is no specific rule that permits its discharge and as such the activity will default to the discretionary activity rule R42.

I not that the WWTP has consent that permits the discharges to air from the operation of the WWTP facility WGN950164(01).

Co ditions of this consent require that the plan be designed, operated, and managed in a way to prevent the discharge of odours that are dangerous, offensive, or objectionable beyond the property boundary.

The purpose of the consent is to manage the discharges from the facilities ventilation systems and not consent permit the discharge of a masking agent to reduce the affects of odours from the plant. So while conditions 11 to 13 which relate to the preparation and update of operations management plans for the management of odour discharges from the facility, the use of odour cannons and the discharge of chemicals to mask odours where not part of the facilities design and therefore the proposed activity is not in general accordance.

As such this assessment is that the discretionary activity consent would be required under R42 for Other Discharges.

Joemar confirms fire report has been sent out and he can redistribute to anyone who hasn't received it if they require.		
Josh confirms this report closed the "Please Explain" letter as per his email sent out 19 th June and adds the independent investigation draft was received yesterday (Weds 21 ^{st)}) and he will work through this with his team and advise us of the findings and what WWL can use it for.

Careys Gully:		
Current Maintenance Issues		
Ed notes an advisory notice was received from Claire McKevitt (GWRC) in early June and as a result all new media for the biofilter is now on site. Currently working with the contractor for media replacement due to happen this week or next.		
Should be replaced up to 2 weeks after they start so mid-July completion likely.		
Odour compliance		
Josh notes there have been odour complaints from Careys Gulley with Veolia report (completed by Tich Mundwa) showing high readings. Ed and Julian advised this was likely related to excavation works being performed outside the boundary area. Alex adds, Tich checked the biofilter around the black boxes and boundary with little odour other than a very minor scent of H2S from the biofilter.		
Tich did mention a strong compost/landfill smell but cannot be determined.		
Josh will raise this with the landfill compliance manager for further details.

Outfall Repair Josh advised he has spoken to the consultant managing the project who has confirmed the piling is		
near completed and they are almost ready to connect the pipe to the piles. Craig advised the outfall update will be going out to the interested parties via email within the next week.		
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Other business:		
Other business: Joemar asked about the circuit breaker replacement and when it will likely be installed. Ed advised the installation may happen next weekend, they just need to make sure they have enough staff to do the works as it will need to be night-works during low inflows to the plant.		
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Will now investigate leaking bypasses in the TAK channel, the Veolia technical team are now managing this. Ed adds the Veolia technical team were onsite yesterday (Weds 21st June) and are currently working on a solution. The commissioning of the milliscreens due July 4th was delayed due to bad weather forecast. H2S monitors now arrived will go on site boundary to test the odour once milliscreens have been in play for a short while. Josh advised a decision on new resource consent was released Wednesday $21^{
m st}$ June and Amanda will be in touch to discuss changing the current compliance to reflect the new consent. Josh suggests a meeting at Porirua WWTP to discuss this new consent with everyone to ensure transparency as to needs to change and what needs to be submitted/when. loemar confirmed he has pre-arranged a meeting with Veolia to discuss this and will bring Amanda up to speed on the outcome of that when she and the team meet at WWTP to discuss the above New Resource Consent) Seaview WWTP Action Effluent consent compliance Julian – Compliant, main outfall repair completed 5th June. Josh noted (via Amanda), that she thought the communications for the outfall repair was done well and was pleased with how WWL kept all parties in the loop. Odour Assessment update WWL have engaged a consultant to undertake the Seaview Odour Control Project. A meeting is set on 1st week of July to ensure everyone is on the same page and will advise GWRC. Monthly report will be prepared to update the status of the odour control project and this can be

viewed via Seaview webpage on WWL website if required.

Chlorine dosing status & consent update

Josh advised on behalf of Amanda that she has completed 90% of this work and if required urgently she can get this memo expedited.

Electrical update, power fluctuations, backup power project

loemar noted the completion of the investigation and is currently completing project brief. This is pending funding from the council and from there it can progress however, it is worth noting that as we are approaching the end of the financial year. If council provide funding, we must determine the funding for each project.

Josh queries if the mussel sampling will continue. Joemar confirms Stantec completed an AEE and have provided their recommendation on the next steps for the samples.

Deodorising update

Josh states that technically as it is discharge to air there should be a resource consent and this should be easy process as it helps address odour. Regional public health confirmed there are no ssues however, currently requires resource consent. This may need to change down the line to permit it.

Josh notes this resource consent may not be a priority to GWRC.

Josh adds we need to address the odour so keep deodoriser going as is but obtain a resource consent moving forward. A meeting will happen soon to discuss this further.

<u>Effluent consent compliance</u> – Julian advised Moa Point is non-compliant as of 19 th April with 90 th percentile limits for faecals due to spikes after the fire and several issues during March at Careys Gully with sludge accumulating in system. Heavy rain caused short and long outfall discharges on 19/4. Josh asked for confirmation that it is spikes rather than a trend. Julian confirmed this was the case and that MLSS was trending downwards.		
<u>Clarifier #3 –</u> Ed advised clarifier was re-commissioned last Friday (21/4), the Process has responded well. The variable speed drive (VSD) on one RAS pump is not working currently. Clarifier #2 will likely to be drained down next month to assess how much remedial works may be needed.		
ACTION – Ed to send Josh an email detailing the clarifier commissioning last week including dates/times etc	Veolia	May
IPS Repairs – Gordon advised the fabrication of the risers is now delayed, looking at 8-14 weeks.		
Julian explained why there was a short outfall discharge i.e., high flows coming into plant with 8 pumps only running but advised they now have 9 pumps running.		
Josh noted there is now increased interest surrounding these discharges from both councillors and the wider public. Blair acknowledged this and noted that it was a huge rain event and there were also excessive volumes in the network itself meaning it too experienced discharges. Ed explained one pump unexpectedly failed and that the other critical factor is the damaged riser pipework that is also failing causing output in one pump to be only around 200 litres per second.

- The consent was granted in 1996 well before the odour canon were in use. While the consent desn't specifically relate to the odour canon, visible discharges should not occur as required in codition 19.
- The odour canon does require consent under our regional rules, it currently is ot consented.
- GWRC have previously requested information around public risk and Regional Pub ic Heal h have responded stating it is not a public health risk. Based on this information we deemed it low risk to allow the continue use of the odour canons in the form of mitigating odour without consent ontil a consent is lodged.
- The compliance officer has taken this complaint to assess next ste's for compliance which to date has included discussions with WWL around the effectiveness of the odour canon in mitigating the odour and the best way to use the canon e.g. directly at the known source volighth into the air (to ensure compliance with visible discharges under condition 19) and actions WWL need to take to ward obtaining consent for odour canon use.
- Enforcement action is not being pursued for the use of the odour canon.
